



Oxford Saints AFC – Code of Conduct

Oxford Saints American Football Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of its members, ensuring a positive and enjoyable experience for all. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches and officers associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with the Chairman (Graeme Taylor), Welfare Officer (Martin Fitzpatrick) or their relevant Rep (Coach Rep – Andrew Day / Player Rep – Deke Morton & Dean Bryan).

As a member of Oxford Saints AFC, you are expected to abide by the following Code of Conduct:

- All Members are required to attend and arrive on time to any Club Football Activity (training, games, etc.) arranged by the Club or Head Coach. Any Member not attending a Club Football Activity must notify the Committee or Head Coach as soon as they are able. Any Member not providing advanced notice of absence or a valid reason for their absence may face removal from future Club Football Activities, suspension or ejection from the Club.
- Each Member is responsible for ensuring they have the minimum mandatory safety equipment. Failure to comply with this will result in removal from Club Football Activities.
- During any Club Activity, all Members must refrain from any activity that will bring the Club into disrepute. Discrimination of any sort based on sex, age, disability, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, religion or other beliefs will not be tolerated. Any complaints received will be investigated and acted upon, and may result in suspension or termination of membership.
- Members are required to pay an annual subscription fee (if applicable), as set by the Club. Failure to keep up to date with Member payments may result in temporary suspension of membership (prohibiting that member from attending any organised team activities) or termination of membership (for repeated offenses). Any unpaid funds will be subject to Civil Recovery, with the offending Member will be reported to BAFA and placed on the Debtors List.
